

Monitoring Process



New Monitoring Methodology: Report

The major aim is to assess *implementation process* of activities set out for 13 priority areas of the Anti-Corruption Strategy and Action Plan, *identify achieved outcomes* as well as *existing* challenges and gaps

1 STAGE: Progress report and Monitoring Tool

Monitoring Tool includes activities, targets, specific timeframes, responsible agency, partner, budget and is to be filled **biannually by responsible agencies**; **NGO input** is included

Two types of ratings:

- i) **process assessment rating** activity is implemented; largely implemented; partly implemented or not implemented;
- ii) **status assessment rating** implementation process is not finalized; implementation is ongoing; implementation is suspended; implementation is terminated or implementation process is finalized.



New Monitoring Methodology: Report

1 STAGE: Progress report and Monitoring Tool

Final assessment is made by Secretariat and Progress Report is prepared

Progress *Report submitted to the ACC* and adopted

2 STAGE: Monitoring Report

Report will be prepared *annually by the ACC Secretariat* to assess implementation process of the Action Plan activities and achieved results

Report will be **based on Progress Reports and Monitoring Tool** submitted by responsible agencies biannually given consideration to the ratings

Monitoring Report will be *submitted to the ACC* for adoption *and to the Government of Georgia*



New Monitoring Methodology: Report

3 STAGE: Evaluation Report

Evaluation Report is aimed at assessing <u>achieved results</u> and <u>their effectiveness/efficiency</u> as well as <u>analysis of existing situation</u>, identification of gaps and challenges in the Action Plan implementation process

Report will be based on *Monitoring Reports* and <u>specific result-oriented</u> <u>indicators</u> set out by the new Action Plan

International *ratings*, *assessment* of international and local organisations, relevant *publications*, in-depth *interviews/consolations* (if necessary) with representatives from responsible agencies, NGOs or experts will be used

Evaluation Report will be *prepared once in two years*



Evaluation Report will be *submitted to the ACC* and the *Government* of Georgia
