

**Multi-Stakeholder Workshop**  
**on the United Nations Convention Against Corruption and its Review Mechanism**  
**Sarajevo, Bosnia and Herzegovina, 25-29 September 2017**

*Location: Hotel Hollywood, Dr. Mustafe Pintola 23, Ilidža 71000 Sarajevo, Bosnia and Herzegovina*

**OBJECTIVES:** The overall objective of this workshop is to develop the participants' capacity to contribute to the implementation of UNCAC and the work of its Implementation Review Mechanism, and to provide a platform for constructive dialogue between civil society, government focal points and the private sector. A full day of sessions and activities will be devoted to exploring ways in which the UNCAC is applicable in the private sector, as well as highlighting the important role which businesses play in the prevention of corruption. More specifically, the workshop seeks to:

- Equip participants with the requisite substantive expertise in UNCAC provisions to undergo and perform reviews as well as addressing the observations emanating from the reviews;
- Inform participants about the methodology and tools for country reviews;
- Build capacity to reproduce workshop sessions at the national/regional level;
- Provide a platform for constructive dialogue and sharing of experiences.

**METHODOLOGY AND DOCUMENTATION:** The workshop is designed to deliver particular learning objectives in an interactive manner for governmental focal points (FPs) and civil society organizations (CSOs), depending on the sessions, which are listed below in the agenda. It will include plenary sessions which will enable participants to provide presentations and engage in discussions with the objective to exchanging information and clarifying key concepts. It will also include interactive exercises and practical applications based on mock scenarios to provide concrete learning opportunities for participants.

CSOs representatives and FPs from the Southeast European regions will participate in the workshop. The entire workshop will be held in English.
